Macroeconomic Overview

Large-cap growth stocks declined during the quarter, with energy the worst performing sector in the Russell 1000® Growth Index. Consumer staples was the only sector to post a positive return and hence was the greatest relative outperformer. Morgan Stanley continues to focus on bottom-up stock selection and the long-term outlook for companies owned in the fund; accordingly, they have had very little turnover in the fund to date, as their ongoing work reaffirms their assessment of quality and competitive advantage in the names they own.

Fund Overview

Stock selection and sector positioning in consumer staples and health care, as well as stock selection in information technology and financials, drove the majority of the fund's underperformance this quarter. Global communications platform Twitter, Inc. was the greatest detractor in the fund. The company reported inline results in July, however management's comments regarding the expected pace of user growth weighed on investor sentiment. The timeline to appoint a new CEO for the company also remained an overhang on the stock through the end of the quarter. Genetic testing and analysis leader Illumina, Inc. and Valeant Pharmaceuticals International, Inc. (Valeant) were the greatest detractors in health care, and the second and third greatest, respectively, across the fund. Both stocks had performed strongly coming into this period, so Morgan Stanley attributes the weakness in part to some mean reversion during a period when the market experienced a great deal of volatility stemming from concerns around China. Valeant faced additional pressure later in the quarter due to greater drug pricing scrutiny across the industry, which Morgan Stanley believes is largely a function of a more politically sensitive environment ahead of presidential elections in the U.S. in 2016. Conversely, consumer discretionary was the top contributor in the fund this quarter, primarily due to strong stock selection. Performance was led by online retail and cloud computing leader Amazon.com, Inc., the greatest contributor across the fund. Its shares advanced after the company reported very strong quarterly results, which beat estimates and were characterized by accelerating revenue growth and profit margin leverage. To a lesser extent, lack of exposure to energy also aided relative results, as this was the worst performing sector in the benchmark, as did an underweight position in materials.

Outlook

As a team, Morgan Stanley believes having a market outlook can be an anchor. Their focus is on assessing company prospects over three to five years, and owning a portfolio of high quality companies with sustainable competitive advantages and diverse business drivers not tied to a particular market environment.
